## Abstract

Oral care for patients with oral ulcers is a key component of their management. This review discusses the current evidence for the use of topical corticosteroids, topical antibiotics, and topical analgesics in the treatment of oral ulcers. The review also discusses the use of systemic corticosteroids and systemic antibiotics in the treatment of oral ulcers. The review concludes that topical corticosteroids are the most effective treatment for oral ulcers, and that systemic corticosteroids and systemic antibiotics are only used in severe cases.
