Case Report

The patient was a 45 years old man who came with chief complaints of gradual onset Progressive left nasal obstruction since one year. Patient had history of septoplasty operation done in same hospital 2 years back. Patient had history of recurrent common cold but no history of epistaxis. His Medical history was insignificant. On anterior rhinoscopic examination, well-circumscribed mass was seen filling the left nasal cavity which probably arose from the middle meatus [1-7]. We had done diagnostic nasal endoscopy in which the reddish mass seen in the left nostril almost touching originating from the left maxillary sinus (Figure 1). The right nasal cavity and nasopharynx appeared normal. The all routine investigation was within normal limits. CT
