Criteria:	All students progressing from a formally recognised course at a formal BU Partner or recognised funding body (e.g. overseas government). 6.5 Chevening Scholarship (External Scholarship)

Mode of Attendance:	Full time
Place of Attendance:	BU campus
Fee Status:	Overseas
Level of Study:	Postgraduate Taught Master's
Criteria:	Must be applying to join a one-year postgraduate Master's course that starts in September/October. Must be a citizen of a Chevening-eligible country at the time of application and intend to return there at the end of the period of study. Hold an Undergraduate degree that is equivalent to at least an upper-second class honours degree in the UK. Must have achieved the minimum Chevening English language requirement (minimum IELTS
	(Academic) 6.5 with minimum 5.5 in each component) or equivalent. Must have completed at least two years' work experience before applying.
Value of award:	Chevening Scholarships are funded by the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) and partner organisations. A full Chevening Scholarship includes tuition fees, travel to and from home country, an arrival allowance, the cost of an entry clearance (visa) application, a grant for thesis or dissertation, an excess baggage allowance, and a monthly personal living allowance.
	Partner organisation, in this instance Bournemouth University, is liable for 20% of the tuition fee with the FCO paying 80%.

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion:

Candidates who are shortlisted are interviewed by the British Embassy or High Commission in their home country.

The deadlines are country specific, but the application window is usually August each year for September entry in the following year. Full details can be obtained: ______

6.9 Music Scholarships

Mode of Attendance:	Full-time or part-time structured
Place of Attendance:	BU campus
Fee Status:	All
Level of Study:	Postgraduate Taught Master's including CPE and LPC, and Master's by Research (MRes).
Criteria:	Students must be able to demonstrate that they are a talented instrumentalist or vocalist, and

- National/international conference attendance (virtual or in person)
- Travel costs to attend mentoring sessions with Lewis-Manning Trustee
- Travel costs to visit specialist centres/different sites in collaboration with Lewis-Manning
- Subscription to specialist journals
- Online learning programmes
- CPD workshops/webinars
- Bespoke education sessions
- Travel costs for six half-day sessions to shadow a Lewis-Manning nurse
- Further resources

Deadline: Applications must be submitted by 9am, Monday 26 July

Selection process: An awarding committee of Bournemouth University staff and Trustees from Lewis-Manning Hospice Care will review applications. Successful applicants will be invited to attend an interview in early September 2021. This will allow time for successful applicants to decide if they would like to write their literature review about an aspect of palliative and end of life care, and/or identify an idea for the final year interprofessional service improvement project.

Deadline and eligibility for inclusion

The deadline for applications is 31 August (September entrants) or 30 November (January entrants). Subject to available funds, the deadline may be extended and publicised through the scholarship webpages. Students who are shortlisted may be invited to an audition. All music scholars are expected to attend weekly lessons with one of the University's specialist tutors, to attend ensembles and to participate in concerts and recitals.

7. Withdrawals and Suspensions

- 7.1 Students must be fully enrolled at the time that the scholarship payment is due. No payment will be made to students who have interrupted or suspended their studies. Students who withdraw prior to the payment date will not be entitled to a pro-rata payment. Enrolment status is checked by the Finance and Performance Team on a monthly basis before triggering card payments and a termly basis for fee waivers.
- 7.2 If a scholarship recipient chooses to suspend their study their scholarship will be frozen. Payments commensurate with the remaining funding for that level of study will recommence when the student returns to study. Time limits apply to a frozen scholarship. Students are usually expected to recommence their studies within 18 months of the date of the suspension to receive the remaining funding.

8. Tracking, reporting and monitoring on scholarships

8.1 All 'automatic' awards (Academic Excellence) will be recorded in the Student Record System (SRS – SITS) for statutory reporting purposes. AskBU Student Services team will manage an administrative overview of competitive awards (by application) and track progress with decision boards.

8.2 An annual report on the overall number and value of all scholarships awarded via funding classifications and scholarship category will be presented to Fees Board in March of each year.

8.3 M&C will provide recommendations to the Fees Board, including feedback on scholarships provision, decisionmaking and award process.

9. Budgets

9.1 Funding for awards is approved by Faculty and central budgets.

9.2 Financial control measures assume the regular checking of a 'random' sample of automatically assessed awards on a monthly basis. Competitive (by application) scholarships will be approved by default on receipt of the award shortlist and selection of the successful recipient(s).

10. Disclaimer

- 10.1 Scholarships will be reviewed on a regular basis and the University reserves the right to review, amend, and introduce new awards and to cease the award of scholarships at any time. A revised (minor) version of this document will be published to take account of any changes to our provision, the terms, conditions & eligibility.
- 10.2 To ensure compliance with Competition & Markets Authority guidance in relation to the accuracy of information, the only permitted changes to online and printed information are through the Scholarships Implementation Group and from a major or minor version of this Policy & Process document. In addition, the University shall have the right (in its sole discretion, but acting reasonably) to recover from you the whole amount (or any part thereof) of the financial element of any Sporting Scholarship already paid to you at the time of termination or suspension of the Sporting Scholarship.
