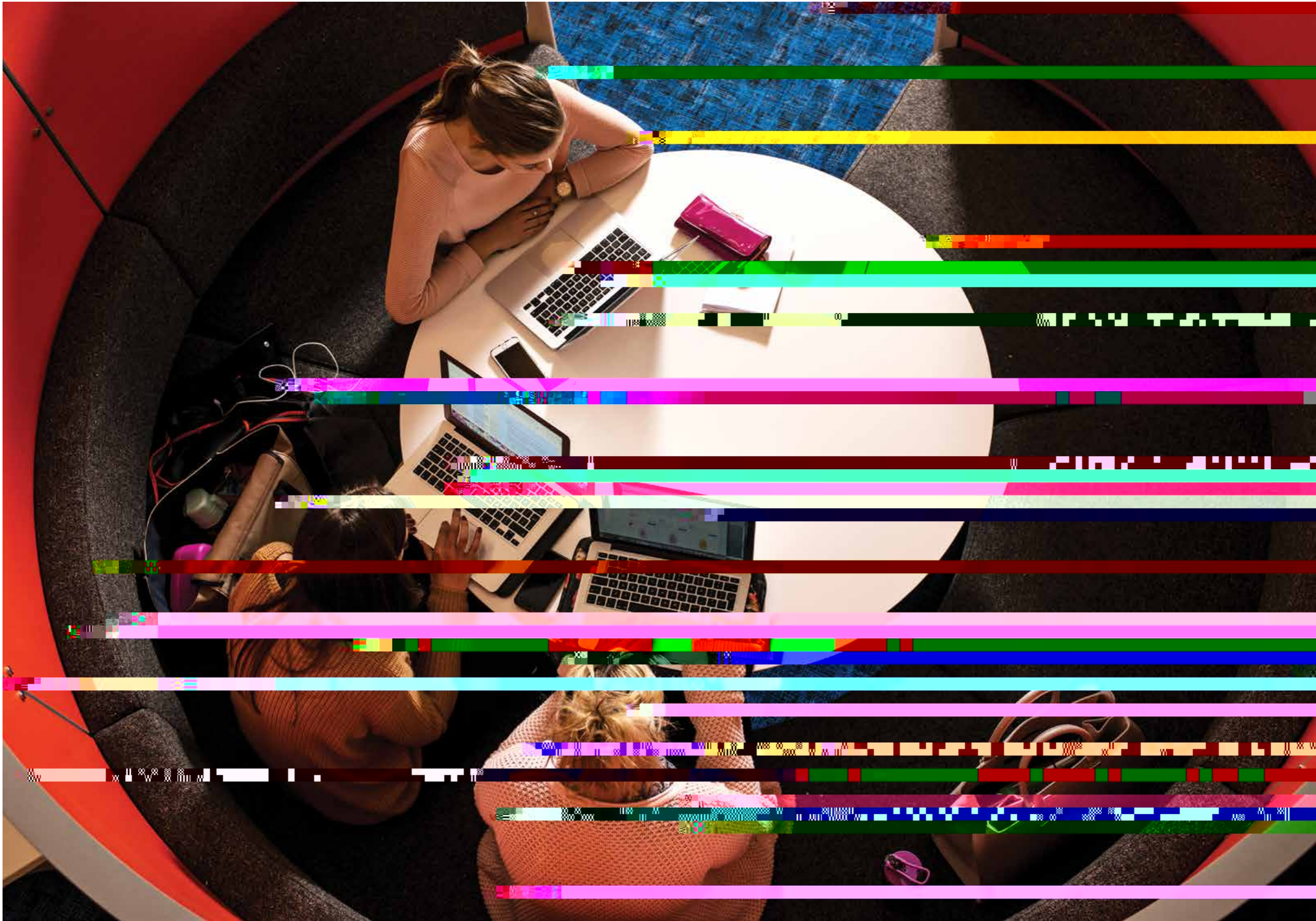

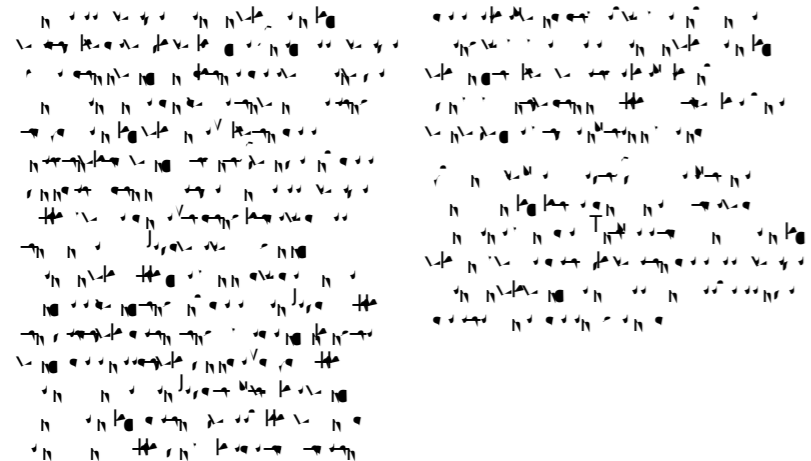
Research proposal



Your research proposal shows your potential to successfully complete your programme. The stronger it is, the more likely it will be that we will want to make you an offer.

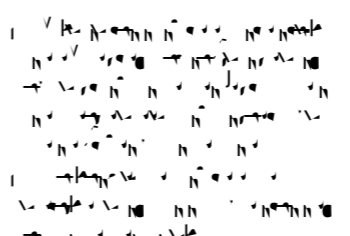
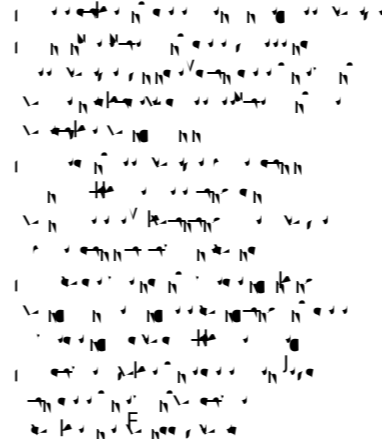
Why is the research proposal important?

The quality of your research proposal plays a significant factor in our decision on whether to accept you onto a postgraduate research programme.

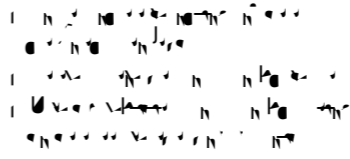


What should the research proposal include?

For non-defined research projects (e.g. Self-funded or Sponsored) research proposals should be approximately 1,500 words and include the following:
